LDI's Sustainability Action Plan is the first step in making a worldwide difference. The Plan sets a bar, guides our daily activity, and fosters transparency as we develop new material constructions and sustainable workflows.

We consider six primary criteria related to toxicity. The goal is to achieve these key targets (when technology allows) without sacrificing the finished product performance:

- Low VOC emissions: Cal 01350 Compliant
- FR-Free: CAL AB 2998 Compliant
- Prop 65 Compliant
- PVC-Free
- PFAS-Free
- Antimicrobial-Free

To aid specifiers in their selection process, we standardized the following material disclosure forms:


- Health Product Declaration (HPD's)
- LEED Declaration
- REACH Compliance
- Living Building Challenge Red List Compliance (LBC RED LIST)
- Practice Greenhealth's Healthy Interiors Compliance (HHI Safer Chemicals Challenge)

The streamlining of production processes to reduce waste and energy consumption is another example of our investment to minimize the impact on the environment and human health. LDI is a pioneer with our print-on-demand approach to upholstery. Low carbon footprint process. Five-yard minimums. No extra lead time. No quality worries. Patterns are never discontinued.
